Dr. Matthäus Wuczowski is Head of Sustainability Management at Niedersachsen Ports.

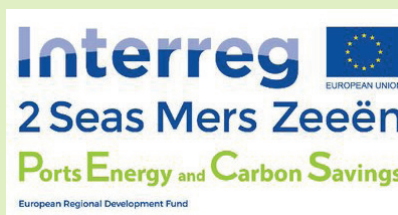
