

Improving Climate Resilience with Blue Green Infrastructure

Cities are particularly susceptible to extreme weather conditions caused by climate change. Blue Green Infrastructure (BGI), such as green corridors, permeable paving, bio-swales and rainwater harvesting, is needed to better adapt to this situation and improve the livability of cities.

It is BEGIN's aim to find and show improved climate adaptation solutions in urban areas, to identify the benefits, and to have measures installed and maintained by social initiatives. Also, BEGIN aims to have BGI perceived as an obvious and integral part of urban development, by developing projects and lowering thresholds.
